### 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebrations

2 This year is our Diamond Anniversary, a Golden 75<sup>th</sup> Jubilee, following after our nation's 50<sup>th</sup> Jubilee last year. Fuhua Primary started as a kampong school before the 2<sup>nd</sup> World War in a tiny village near the site of Nanyang Technology University (NTU). Through the years, it has flourished with many alumni now serving actively in our public service, educational institutes, in the community and in commerce, each of them contributing to the growth of Singapore.

3 Our Immediate Past Chairman, Mr Goh Chye Huat BBM, has served eminently for the past 33 years as the Chairman of our School Advisory Committee (SAC). This year, he has handed the baton of leadership to an alumnus, Mr Ong Eng Loon, who is also a community leader. Mr Ong has served our school with distinction, and is personally interested in education. For his work with the community and the school, our new Chairman, Mr Ong Eng Loon, has been conferred the Pingat Bakti Masyarakat or PBM by the President of Singapore. We want to congratulate Mr Ong for this National Day Award. Another SAC member, Mdm Samatha Goh Chew Hoon, was also awarded the Ministry of Education's Service to Education Award for her work in our school. We also want to welcome to our SAC, Mr Low Woo Swee, Mr Kenny Teo Meng Keh, Mr Alfred Lien Kim Seng, and Mr Koh Wee Kwang. At this juncture, I like to place on record our thanks to Mr Ong Keau PBM and Mr Ong Eng Lam who have served their terms in office. They will remain in our SAC as alumnus officials.

4 This year, we have our young alumna, Miss Thiam Jia Min, coming back as our Guest-of-Honour for our SMART Awards Day. Miss Thiam graduated from our school after her PSLE in 2003, won a Public Service Commission (PSC) Scholarship and is currently serving as Deputy Public Prosecutor/State Counsel in the Attorney-General's Chambers. The students were inspired by her speech and I am sure will strive to reach higher grounds in their endeavours.

5 To celebrate our 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, the school had organised successfully impactful events in alignment with our role as the Centre of Excellence in ICT for Teaching and Learning in the West Zone. At the zonal level, a total of 63 teachers shared their lessons in ICT with their colleagues in the West Zone ICT Seminar 2016 on 15 July 2016.

6 In the months of June and July, the school organised our Annual National Primary School Photography Competition. We have the largest participation from schools this year. A total of 51 primary schools from Singapore were trained and competed in this event. Our very own student, Seow Zheng Yang from 6 Loyalty was shortlisted and won one of the top prizes in this competition.



7 At the international level, the school organised the Global Finals of 'Speak!' International Competition. Students from China, Indonesia and Singapore interacted with one another honing their English speaking skills, through rounds of dialogues, drama and presentations. Our students not only played hosts to these international students but also built up their confidence and picked up the finer points of oratorical finesse through the gruelling sessions. We received a thumbs up from our international friends.

8 In the same month, we celebrated our SMART Awards Day, where the very best from the school were presented medals and prizes for their various achievements in the academic, social and emotional, physical and aesthetics fields and also for their outstanding character. Brian Lee Shen Yang was the valedictorian of the 2015 cohort and received the Principal's Medallion, a first among equals.

### Homecoming

9 We will round up our 75<sup>th</sup> Golden Jubilee celebration with a Homecoming to coincide with the Mid-Autumn Festival. Our Junior Alumni, who are currently studying at prestigious Junior Colleges, have volunteered their services and will be organising an evening of fun and enjoyment. This will be on Sunday 25 Sep from 4.30pm to 9.30pm. It will be an evening of community celebrations with our neighbours from Westmere, Ivory Heights and the Jurong East Resident Committee. The Advisor to the Yuhua Grassroots Organisations, Ms Grace Fu, will grace the occasion. We hope to see you at this celebration. ## The Hundred Languages of Children

This poem by the founder of the Reggio-Emilia approach beautifully conveys the important roles imagination and discovery play in early childhood learning. Much of Reggio-Emilia philosophy is based on protecting children from becoming subjected too early to institutionalized doctrines which often make learning a chore rather than an extension of natural curiosity.

The child is made of one hundred.

The child has  
a hundred languages  
a hundred hands  
a hundred thoughts  
a hundred ways of thinking  
of playing, of speaking.

A hundred.

Always a hundred  
ways of listening  
of marveling, of loving  
a hundred joys  
for singing and understanding  
a hundred worlds  
to discover  
a hundred worlds  
to invent  
a hundred worlds  
to dream.

The child has  
a hundred languages  
(and a hundred hundred hundred more)  
but they steal ninety-nine.  
The school and the culture  
separate the head from the body.  
They tell the child:  
to think without hands  
to do without head  
to listen and not to speak  
to understand without joy  
to love and to marvel  
only at Easter and at Christmas.

They tell the child:  
to discover the world already there  
and of the hundred  
they steal ninety-nine.

They tell the child:  
that work and play  
reality and fantasy  
science and imagination  
sky and earth



reason and dream  
are things  
that do not belong together.

And thus they tell the child  
that the hundred is not there.  
The child says:  
No way. The hundred is there.
